



NATIVE AMERICANS IN PHILANTHROPY

FOR INDIGENOUS NON-PROFITS

IRC 7871 provides an alternative by which Indigenous non-profits are able to receive qualifying donations and contributions from non-governmental funders without being a 501(c)(3).

To qualify they must be an “integral part” of the Nation/Tribe’s programs and services and are providing charitable and public good. It may seem that this would be a difficult threshold to meet and that’s why Native Americans in Philanthropy and Network for Native Futures has designed a training workshop to assist Indigenous non-profits in understanding how to maximize this potential without running afoul of the IRS.

Native Americans in Philanthropy has partnered with Network for Native Futures in the development of a training workshop designed to assist funders in gaining greater understanding of these tools. Most importantly, the workshop will provide practical steps as to how funders can incorporate this potential into their strategies and programs.

“PL 638 & IRC 7871: Important tools for development in Indian Country” is designed to provide Indigenous non-profit boards, C.E.O.s, program managers, and development personnel with a working understanding of the advantages and potentials of these tools.
